Property Rights: Foundation for a Free Society



W. Taylor Reveley III, Esq. President Emeritus and John Stewart Bryan Professor of Jurisprudence

William & Mary Law School, Williamsburg

W. Taylor Reveley III joined the faculty of William & Mary Law School in 1998, acting as Dean of its law school from August of 1998 to February of 2008, at which time he became the University's 27th President. He retired from the presidency in 2018, continuing to teach at the law school. Previously, he practiced law at Hunton and Williams for 28 years, serving as managing partner of the firm for nine years. He also clerked for Justice William J. Brennan Jr., of the US Supreme Court, and spent 13 months in 1972-73 as a Fellow of the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars and an International Affairs Fellow of the Council on Foreign Relations (studying the war powers). Among his many professional accomplishments and services to the practice of law, he helped create the Virginia State Bar's Section on the Education of Lawyers.
